INDIVIDUAL RETIREMENT ACCOUNT (IRA) GIFTS — If you are 70½ or older, consider making a gift through your IRA. The IRS allows direct transfers totaling up to \$100,000 per year to 501(c)3 charities without having to count the transfer as income for federal tax purposes. Kindly instruct your broker to make the check payable to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, and send to **P.O. Box 28, Hartford, CT 06141-0028**. Please call the Appeal Office (800.781.2550) with questions.

PLEDGED GIFTS — Appeal gifts may be paid over five months. Please consider including your first month's payment with your pleage card.
